







Business Vacant Postions by Business Age, Second Quarter of 2023







Type of Disability for Persons with Disabilities Aged 15 Years and Over, by Age Group and Sex, Canada, Ontario (2017)







Percentage of Workforce Anticipated to Work On-Site or Remotely Over the Next Three Months, by Business Age Second Quarter 2023








Durham Region Commuting Patterns
