Labour Market Insights Report



Executive Summary

The **2025 Durham Labour Market Insights Report for Q4** provides a detailed snapshot of employment activity in the Durham Region from **October through December 2025**. Divided into two sections, the **Job Demand** section examines employer hiring activity and workforce needs, while the **Job Search** section explores jobseeker behaviour and engagement across Durham Workforce Authority (DWA) tools. Drawing on job postings from over 50 publicly accessible job boards, the report captures the evolving relationship between employer demand, occupational change, and jobseeker interests as the region closed out the year.

Key Labour Market Highlights

- **12,059 active job postings** were recorded during the final quarter of 2025, including **9,658 new postings**, reflecting a modest seasonal softening compared to Q3 while maintaining strong overall posting levels.
- **3,487 unique employers** were actively hiring across Durham Region, indicating continued employer confidence despite year-end slowdowns.
- The **average job posting duration increased to 18.5 days**, suggesting that some positions, particularly in specialized or in-demand roles, are taking longer to fill.

Full-time employment remained dominant, though shifts toward greater employment diversity were evident:

- **67% of postings were full-time**, while **30% were part-time** and **3% casual**.
- **85% of postings were permanent**, with contract and temporary roles making up a slightly larger share than in previous quarters.

Sector and Occupational Trends

Durham's labour market in Q4 continued to be shaped by **sales, service, healthcare, and education-related roles**, though notable rebalancing occurred across sectors.

Top in-demand occupations included:

- **Retail salespersons and visual merchandisers** with 629 postings
- **Food counter attendants and kitchen helpers** with 461 postings
- **Home support workers and caregivers** recording 336 postings
- **Retail and wholesale trade managers** at 273 postings
- **Licensed practical nurses** recording 244 postings

The **health care and social assistance sector** remained the largest hiring sector, with 2,084 postings, followed by retail trade with 1,795, administrative and support services with 823, construction with 663, and educational services with 624.

Skills, Wages, and Experience Requirements

Employer demand in Q4 continued to emphasize **transferable and foundational skills**, with the most frequently requested skills being **communication, management, customer service, driving, and organizational skills**.

Notably, **82% of job postings did not specify experience requirements**, and **80% did not specify education requirements**, reinforcing the accessibility of many available roles, particularly in sales, service, and support occupations.

Wage transparency and compensation levels continued to improve, with the average posted wage rising to \$28.61 and the median posted wage to **\$23.69**, both up **2%** from the previous quarter.

Health occupations posted the highest median salaries, followed by **natural and applied sciences**. At the sector level, **utilities** saw the

strongest wage growth, up 23%, while educational services recorded the largest wage decline.

Jobseeker Behaviour & Insights

Jobseeker engagement moderated slightly in Q4, consistent with typical year-end patterns. **32,558 total interactions** were recorded across DWA tools during the quarter, with the **Job Board** remaining the primary access point, accounting for **22,490 interactions** and **17,221 job post clicks**.

Jobseeker interest continued to concentrate on **entry-level and mid-skill roles**, with TEER 4 and 5 occupations accounting for the majority of interactions. The most engaged occupational categories were **sales and service, business and administration, and trades and transport**.

Top keyword searches were “**warehouse**,” “**administrative clerk**,” “**personal support worker**,” “**retail**,” and “**customer service**.” Special interest filters such as **work-from-home, apprenticeship, casual, and seasonal employment** remained consistently used, highlighting ongoing demand for flexibility and accessible pathways into work.

Conclusion

Durham’s labour market closed out 2025 on a position of **stability and resilience**, with strong employer participation, sustained job demand, and steady wage growth despite seasonal and sector-specific adjustments. While posting volumes softened modestly in Q4, the region continued to demonstrate a diverse employment base supported by healthcare, retail, construction, and essential services.

As Durham Region moves into 2026, these findings underscore the importance of **continued investment in skills development, workforce mobility, and sector diversification**. Coordinated efforts among employers, educators, and workforce development partners will remain critical to supporting inclusive growth, improving job quality, and strengthening long-term labour market resilience across the region.







Full time vs. Part time.




Job Duration


Top Hourly Wages

Top median hourly wages by occupation.





Top median yearly salaries by occupation.





Top in-demand sectors based on posting count.














Top In-Demand Skills

What skills are employers looking for by occupational TEER Category?
















Number of interactions by age range.


Number of interactions by self-identified gender.


Number of interactions by job type (if used).











Number of interactions by job type (if used).




Job Duration Interest








